Why reorganisation?

- Government has outlined a policy to abolish 'two-tier areas', and replace with a single unitary council*
 - Oxfordshire is two-tier
 - Berkshire is already unitary including West Berkshire and Reading
- Proposals must meet Government criteria:
 - Be based around sensible economic areas and geography
 - Councils must be the right size (initially suggested 500k, but subsequent indications that 300-350k would be accepted)
 - Deliver sustainable high-quality services
 - Enable devolution
 - Enable strong community engagement and empowerment



^{*} These are the common terms used – parish councils represent a separate tier of local councils

What is the LGR decision process?

- Oxfordshire councils invited to submit final proposals by 28 November 2025
- On receiving proposals, Secretary of State can:
 - Implement a proposal as proposed;
 - Implement with modifications; or
 - Not implement the proposal
- SoS must consult Councils, but consent is not required
- Anticipate a 6-8 week consultation period, but dates unknown at this stage
- Final decision will be made by the Secretary of State








What's being proposed?








The current boundary between West Berkshire and Reading is not a 'sensible' economic area and geography





Rationale for Revised Boundary for Reading

- Sensible economic geography
 - Proximity to Reading
 - Transport corridors
 - Recognising communities whole wards and parishes
- Still enabling wider LGR across Oxfordshire
- Efficiency of delivering services from Reading



What does this mean for Parish Councils

- Parish Councils would remain as they are
- Reading has not proposed to abolish any Parish Council under these proposals
- Parish Councils would continue to deliver their services as now
- Reading would become the Council Tax collecting authority
- Reading would establish a joint protocol with Parish Councils, ensuring we provide support where needed and have strong communication between the Councils
